34th Annual Comprehensive

Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery Review Course

Monday - Friday, October 27 - 31, 2008

Specifically designed for oral and maxillofacial surgeons and residents, the primary objective of this course is to focus on comprehensive reviews covering all phases of OMS and advanced cosmetic maxillofacial surgery. The secondary objective of this course is to emphasize critical aspects of surgery with scientific support so as to prepare surgeons and residents for specialty examinations. The case formats in all lectures stress the techniques used and the scientific justifications for those techniques.

At the conclusion of this educational activity, participants should be able to:

- use knowledge and material as a study guide for specialty examinations,
- identify areas of weakness requiring further study,
- recognize the format and style of board questions, and
- demonstrate increased knowledge of oral and maxillofacial surgery.

18th Annual Course in Advanced

Cosmetic Maxillofacial Surgery

Friday, Saturday & Sunday, October 31 - November 2, 2008

The objective of this in-depth course for cosmetic maxillofacial surgeons and residents is to cover the latest advances in: cosmetic patient evaluation, browlifting, midface rejuvenation, conservative rejuvenation techniques including Botox and soft tissue fillers, skin resurfacing, advanced blepharoplasty, rhinoplasty and facelifting techniques. During the last two days of the course, didactic sessions are held in the mornings with follow-up cadaver practicum labs in the afternoons.

At the conclusion of this educational activity, participants should be able to:

- use knowledge and material as a study guide for specialty examinations,
- identify areas of weakness requiring further study,
- recognize the format and style of board questions, and
- demonstrate increased knowledge of cosmetic maxillofacial surgery.

The fee for each course includes: handout materials covering all speakers' lectures, a buffet lunch each day, and self-serve beverages available during the morning and afternoon breaks. Please do not bring recording devices or cellular phones into the lecture rooms or labs.
