Salvage of the Failing Implant

Overview

With the improved accessibility to patients and the increased placement of dental implants by all specialties within dentistry, it is only expected that the number of less-than-ideal results also will increase. This 60-minute webinar will discuss the oral and maxillofacial surgeon's role in the potential salvage of these situations.

His clinical interests include the surgical

management of temporomandibular joint disorders and the treatment of the difficult implant patient. He has been involved in the placement of thousands of dental implants ranging from the most straightforward to the most complex of cases.

Dr. Hussain's particular area of expertise is the management of the "compromised" or "failing" dental implant patient.
