Dear Mr. Gordon,

Thank you for your leadership in tackling the COVID-19 pandemic in Michigan. Although executive orders curtailed many of our services, we agree that the measures taken were necessary to flatten the curve of disease transmission. Now, as in the spring, Oral and maxillofacial surgeons are treating patients in hospitals and in their offices. OMS office procedures include treatment of patients with active infections and acute pain, patients with benign and malignant pathology, as well as patients with facial trauma any of whom may also have COVID-19.

Our office efforts keep patients out of hospital emergency departments. When patients with oral and maxillofacial disorders do require hospitalization, the oral and maxillofacial surgeon is there to treat them. Oral and maxillofacial surgeons should be viewed as primary and essential providers in this pandemic and should have access to appropriate PPE and COVID-19 vaccination.

I am appealing to you as well as Governor Gretchen Whitmer to assure that Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons and their clinical staff including dental assistants are included as front line workers who receive the first round of COVID-19 vaccine in Michigan.
