

Copyright Tips & Standards

Presentations:
Using borrowed content in your **presentation, not just published work**, still requires you to obtain reuse permission from the copyright holder.

Borrowed Content: Does *not* just include material from journals or recognized publications. Anything borrowed from a website, video, recording, or even social media, is protected by copyright law!

But I cited my references: Citing your source does not cover your copyright duties. You must still receive written permission from the copyright holder.

Remember, sharing content requires copyright permission whether you're using it in a presentation, sharing it on an intranet, or even making copies and distributing them.

How do I obtain permission? Most often, permission can be obtained through Copyright Clearance. If not, contact the publisher and/or author.

As you seek permission, be aware you need permission for exactly what you're reusing. If its one figure, the release should be for the figure. If you have permission to reuse an entire article, this does not mean you free to reuse bits & pieces.
